COMMITTEE REPORTS

ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE

Your Environmental Committee last met on November 1. No activity by IDEM in amending the NPDES Rule 5 storm water rules for construction activity or for the SSOA rules for the "general air permits" has been reported.

On the afternoon of February 6 at the Winter Workshops, the environmental committee will present their break-out session. This year, this session is designed as advanced training for environmental managers.

The committee heard a presentation on RICE NESHAP (often called RICE MACT or GACT), the maximum achievable control technology for Reciprocating Internal Combustion Engines. These include stationary engines used for generators, hydraulic pumps, fire pumps, water pumps, compressors, etc. The presentation generated a flurry of inquiries to the US EPA and state agencies as to confirmation of the information and what engines do not need notifications to the agencies. Members are encouraged to bring their list of internal combustion engines to the Winter Workshops where a more detailed presentation on RICE will be given. Also at the Winter Workshop, Rose McDaniel of IDEM will be presenting an online interactive training session for IDEM's new web-based NPDES reporting. This will allow us to directly enter our discharge data and testing results without having to mail hardcopies to IDEM.

All members interested in environmental compliance or being a part of the committee are most welcome to attend.

SAFETY COMMITTEE

As 2012 quickly closes out, I hope this letter finds you well and on the heels of a successful and therefore safe year. Year end for the Safety Committee has us vigorously planning for what we want to accomplish in 2013.

As you are all well aware, February brings the Winter Workshops, the Safety workshop and Awards ceremonies.

This year's slate of speakers are heavy on MSHA compliance and include our yearly update on pressing issues with the MSHA, North Central District Supervisor, Steve Richetta. As usual, we will be putting together a list of questions and/or concerns that we would like for him to address. While we often get responses that are as vague as the standards they are based on, it is a good opportunity to have our voices heard and allows them to see things from a different point of view if they have not already.

We have also secured the MSHA, Educational Policy & Development (EPD) and Small Mines representative, Mike Jackley, to give us some insight and compliance directive associated with and as a result of the new guarding guideline called "Guarding Phase II - Guarding Machinery at Metal & Nonmetal Mines." It is my hope that we can get some of the compliance questions answered and clear up any potential misconceptions or interpretational discrepancies that arise from inspector to inspector, out of the way from the start. Indianapolis Field Office Supervisor, Lawrence King, will be on hand to provide enforcement information and directions.

Our final speaker is Dr. Norman Woods with Elevated Safety Systems and will be speaking on "Suspension Trauma - the Fall Protection Worked...Now what?" This session will give us great information and help us to plan for the steps to have in place and take to eliminate the potentially harmful effects of remaining suspended in fall protection for an extended period of time when we do not have a plan to "get them down". This is normally a very well attended session so come early and get the good seats up front.

The new venue has given us the opportunity to enjoy and interact with vendors that supply our industry. I am sure that there will be a handful of vendors at the trade show that can assist you with any safety supplies or applicable concerns that you may have. Please take a moment to visit the trade show area to see any of the newest, latest and greatest, PPE or other products.

On another, equally important note, Ron Bucci, ESC coordinator and IMAA safety trainer has put together a schedule of upcoming training opportunities. If you, or a contractor working for you, need this service, please contact the IMAA office to schedule.



TEACHERS' WORKSHOP AT WORK

CLOVERDALE ELEMENTARY TEACHERS ATTEND THREE-DAY NATURAL RESOURCES WORKSHOP

With the Martin Marietta Aggregates Quarry located right in Cloverdale Elementary School's neighborhood, fourth grade teachers, Mrs. Bookwalter and Mrs. Kemp, decided to attend a threeday workshop this summer, sponsored by Indiana Mineral Aggregates Association. Their goal was to gather information for both their Science and Social Studies classes regarding Indiana's natural resources and how they play a part in our local economy. After learning about all aspects of the mining industry, touring several quarries, and actually operating some heavy equipment, they returned to school with a plan to present a two week unit to their students.

In Science, students were able to demonstrate how heat and pressure can change rock by making "metamorphic sandwiches". Students used their observation and classifying skills to tell the difference between rocks and minerals. They then took the activity further by using the scientific method to become "mineral detectives", and learn about the properties of minerals. Students analyzed their mineral specimens and used industry standards like the Moh's Hardness Scale to hardness value their samples and the streak test to determine the true color of the mineral.

Students learned that many of the products they use every day, including toothpaste, are made from rocks and minerals. Students used the minerals calcium carbonate and sodium bicarbonate to create their own toothpaste. Students were divided into groups to produce one marketable toothpaste recipe. These were judged on color and flavor. The students then developed an advertising campaign which included a slogan, jingle, rap, or song that would

help sell their product.

In Social Studies, students learned how vital the mining and aggregate industry is to Indiana's economy. Students became acquainted with the career opportunities related to minerals and mining such as geologists, crusher operators, blasters, environmental managers, and many more. Descriptions of mining related jobs were placed up and down the 4th grade hall. Students were given a set of clues describing the interests and skills needed for a career. Students had to then match the clues to a specific mining related career.

In the birdseed mining activity, students learned that mining can be very complex. Student groups came up with a name for their mining operation and designated one student to be the company controller/ accountant. They then had to "bid" on a mine. Once the mine was purchased, they learned about the rules and regulations that need to be followed. Teachers in the role of MSHA officials (Mine Safety and Health Administration) handed out fines for "unsafe" mining practices. Students learned about scarcity of certain natural resources in different areas mined and mineral depletion. They also learned how to calculate the value of the resources found and the profit they made after expenses. It was a lesson also on how the mining industry ensures that it is a good steward of the land and how it has a plan to restore mining areas to their original or better condition when done.

For Contractors / Associate Members interested in the 24-hour class, employees will need to attend all 3 days of training. An 8-hour Surface refresher class will satisfy the requirements of Part 46 and Part 48 (B)-Surface and will be priced at \$30 per person. New Miner and Annual Refresher Classes have a minimum of 10 participants and a maximum of 30 participants.

GUS EDWARDS ELECTED AS NSSGA PRESIDENT/CEO

Gus Edwards, NSSGA's executive vice president since 2008, has been elected by the Board of Directors to succeed Joy Pinniger as the association's president and CEO upon her retirement Nov. 2. Edwards began his service with the National Stone Association in 1997 as vice president for public affairs. After the merger of NSA and the National Aggregates Association in 2000, he continued as vice president for communications and community relations until his appointment as executive vice president.

Prior to joining NSA, he was vice president for environment, health and safety with The Jefferson Group, a Washington, D.C., consulting firm. He had previously served as U.S. deputy assistant secretary of commerce for oceans and atmosphere and deputy assistant administrator for external affairs at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Those appointments were preceded by 12 years working on Capitol Hill

as chief of staff to a member of the U.S. House of Representatives and a U.S. senator. Before moving to Capitol Hill, Edwards was a newspaper reporter in Virginia. He was educated at the Virginia Military Institute, the George Washington University and Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government.
