## Legislative Committee News – contributed by NSSGA



### **MSHA Legislation introduced in Senate**

Senators Rockfeller (D-WV), Harkin (D-IA), Murray (D-WA) and Manchin (D-WV) have announced the Robert C. Byrd Mine and Workplace Safety and Health Act of 2011 (S.153). They are hoping to get bipartisan support for the legislation. The legislation is the result of last year's explosion at the Upper Big Branch Mine, which killed 29 miners. This legislation is similar to the legislation that was defeated in the House during the lame duck session. Committee staff says it includes all mines and there are no exceptions, including coal, evaporites, and aggregates.

### **Safety Committee News – by Matt Bunner, Chair**

I would like to thank all those brave men and women who fought through the freezing rain and sleet to attend our safety workshop and awards luncheon. I would also like to thank Brian Thompson, MSHA Field Office Supervisor, for stepping in and filling Steve Richetta's shoes. He made both our session and luncheon huge successes. This year we awarded 115 individual plants, representing 32 companies for their safety efforts. Seventy-one plants were awarded for 1 year to 4 years of safe work, while 44 plants represented 5 years to 18 years of safe work. The total injury free time recognized was the equivalent of 571 years.

Many thanks to Brian Thompson and Charlie Dame (MSHA) and Mark Savit (Patton Boggs) for providing a lot of good information and answers to our Producer and Associate Members' questions. We are hopeful to receive even more answers to some questions that were asked, but could not be answered, and send them out to the Association Members as soon as we get them. Remember, the focus is on managing employee's safety and not managing citations.

Safety tip: Focus on thorough pre-operational checks and daily workplace exams, and you will control a large portion of the hazards and potential citations lurking in your quarries and plants. Do not take these documents lightly.

Our next Safety committee meeting is scheduled for May 28th at the Association Office.

### **Terry Browning to receive prestigious NSSGA Safety & Health Award**

– from NSSGA eDigest & Washington Watch

Terry Browning, safety and health manager for Vulcan Materials Company's Midwest region in Naperville, Illinois has been named the National Stone, Sand & Gravel Association's (NSSGA) 2010 James M. Christie Safety & Health Professional by a panel of NSSGA members for his "leadership in helping to dramatically reduce injuries among aggregates workers."

Created in 1987, the James M. Christie Safety and Health Professional of the Year award recognizes an individual who, through his or her work in the association, has made superior and substantial contributions to his or her company's — and the industry's — efforts toward proactive safe and health operating practices.

The award presentation is scheduled as part of NSSGA's Annual Honors Awards ceremony on March 23, 2011, at NSSGA's 2011 Annual Convention in Las Vegas. The convention coincides with the ConExpo-Con/Agg.

For more than two decades, Browning has been instrumental in leading efforts to reduce injuries and illnesses, NSSGA says. "These efforts have contributed to consecutive years in reducing the incidence rate in the aggregates industry to a record low," according to the association.

Since Browning's 2003 arrival at Vulcan Materials Company, he worked to change company culture so that all workers have a say in efforts to reduce injuries and illnesses. Browning also developed best practices in loss control systems and audits.

Furthermore, says NSSGA, he has been involved in efforts to implement the industry's Safety Pledge by which companies commit to helping the broader aggregates industry to reduce injuries and illnesses. Browning has taken a lead role in helping reduce Vulcan's injury incidence rate by 50 percent.

Browning also was an important NSSGA Safety and Health Committee member in thwarting the 2008 S-Miner legislation believed to be counter to practices that actually improve worker safety. He has presented at numerous U.S. Mine Safety and Health Administration's (MSHA) Spring Thaw meetings and has been honored by four different states as safety man of the year.

"Terry's diligent work as a long-time active leader of NSSGA's Safety and Health Committee, to boost safety awareness, is a great example of the aggregates industry's commitment to worker safety celebrated by the James M. Christie Award," said NSSGA President and CEO Joy Wilson in a press statement. "Terry [Browning] embodies all that's excellent about NSSGA's member companies' commitment to the well-being of their employees."

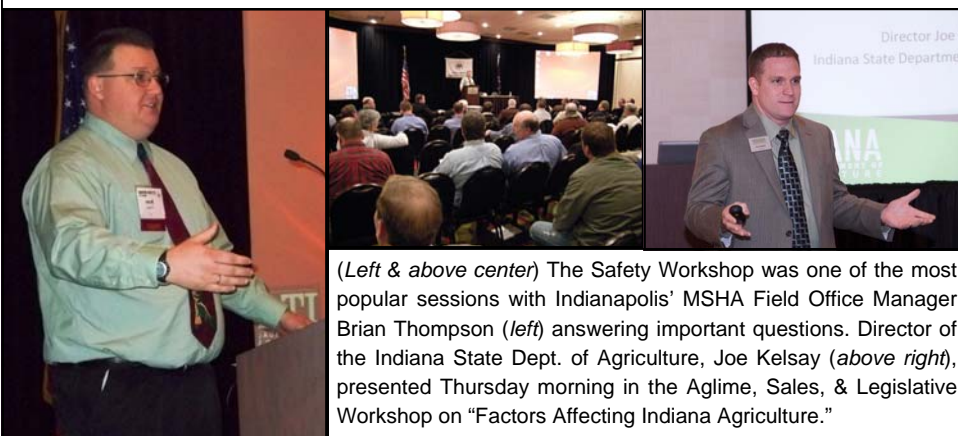

## Safety Pro in a Box — contributed by Neal H. Merrifield, MSHA

Neil Merrifield, Administrator for Metal and Non-Metal: "I am pleased to join with the National Stone, Sand and Gravel Association to announce the release of a new comprehensive online compilation of education and training tools for the aggregates industry", Safety Pro in a Box. "This repository of compliance assistance materials is aimed at helping mine operators new to the industry, as well as operators of small mines." Safety Pro in a Box can be accessed on Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA's) website at: [http://www.msha.gov/safetypro\\_in\\_a\\_box/index.asp](http://www.msha.gov/safetypro_in_a_box/index.asp).

As Mine Safety and Health Administration Assistant Secretary Joseph A. Main said in a recent press release, "this resource was designed to provide meaningful assistance to new operators who may be unfamiliar with the safety and health requirements that apply to their operations. I am particularly pleased with the NSSGA's participation in this effort to compile these materials."

Assistant Secretary Main also noted that since small mine operators often don't have safety departments like those at larger operations, this information can provide small mine operators the necessary training tools to ensure compliance with MSHA safety and health standards. The materials included in "Safety Pro in a Box," all of which were produced by MSHA's National Mine Health and Safety Academy in Beaver, W.Va., include MSHA handbooks on accident/illness reporting procedures and metal/nonmetal inspection procedures; instructor guides for conducting safety and health audits at aggregates operations; on-the-job training modules for sand, gravel and crushed stone; an instructor guide for establishing an occupational health program for respirable crystalline silica; videos; and training modules on highwall hazards, personal protective equipment, hearing conservation and workplace exams.

Compiling the information in one location on the MSHA website makes it convenient for operators to download for use in training employees or developing safety and health programs.

Please note that – while very instructive – these materials do not cover all elements needed for full compliance with MSHA regulations and standards. Please feel free to contact your local MSHA district or field office if you have any questions, or for additional information.

## SILICA DATABASE NOW AVAILABLE — provided by NSSGA

NSSGA has developed a searchable database of peer-reviewed and published information regarding ambient crystalline silica as a service to member companies. NSSGA member companies can use this database to quickly, effectively and factually respond to concerns raised by regulatory agencies, concerned citizens, environmental advocacy groups and other company stakeholders. NSSGA member companies can also use information in the database to prepare for public hearings and/or agency negotiations regarding plant expansions, new plant permits and/or new construction projects.

The database can help NSSGA member companies avoid surprises when various stakeholders cite literature improperly or in a biased manner. It currently contains about 200 papers and resources and will be updated regularly. The database includes links to all documents and articles and is available in two formats: Access and Excel.
