**Obituary — Norman A. "Pete" Wanstrath**, (March 26, 1924 - March 2, 2011), age 86 of Batesville, died Wednesday, March 2, 2011 at St. Andrew's Health Campus. Born March 25, 1924 in Batesville, he is the son of Johanna (Nee: Bramlage) and Theodore Wanstrath. He married Rita Jane Gehring August 21, 1948 at Holy Family Church in Oldenburg and she preceded him in death May 26, 2009. Pete served in the Navy during World War II on an LST (landing ship tank) used to launch amphibious vessels and their crew onto beach heads. Pete was proud of his Navy service and kept in regular contact with his Navy buddies. Returning home from the service, he joined the family business and became co-owner and operator of the New Point Stone Company for nearly 50 years before retiring.

Pete was a member of St. Louis Church, the Batesville V.F.W. Post #3183, the Prell-Bland American Legion Post #271 (where he was the longest tendered member), the Knights of Columbus Council #1461 as a 4th Degree Knight and Hillcrest Country Club. He was a former Chairman of the Batesville Planning and Zoning Board and former Chairman of the Board of the Batesville State Bank.

His family laughed when the word retirement came up. Pete never fully retired. It did provide him the opportunity though to spend more time doing the things he loved. After "retirement" he enjoyed taking the grandkids fishing. An avid sports fan, he liked watching sports on T.V. and followed the Cincinnati Reds and I.U. basketball. He also liked to golf, for many years bowled in a couple of leagues and even up until last summer was pitching horseshoes in a local league. In his younger days he enjoyed going to the horse races and for a time was a thoroughbred owner. He and Rita Jane were able to travel quite a bit over the years at home and abroad and count trips to Hawaii, Australia and Germany among their favorites. When it got cold, he would to travel to Florida with his friends to keep their golf games sharp over the winter.

He is survived by daughters and son-in-laws Lu Ann and John Zeszut of Cincinnati, Jan and Terry Carlson of Ft. Myers Beach, Florida, Julie and Bob Jackson of Dayton, Ohio; sons and daughter-in-laws Ken and Deborah Wanstrath, Randy and Carolyn Wanstrath, Russ and Jama Wanstrath, Jim Wanstrath, all of Batesville; sister Dorothy Olinger of Greensburg; 14 grandchildren and nine great grandchildren. In addition to his wife and parents, he is also preceded in death by his son Glenn and brother Louis Wanstrath. The family request memorials to the Batesville Youth Baseball/Softball Complex fund or St. Louis School Tuition Angels.

## BIC Matters: Highway Funding Update — by Vicki Kitchin, BIC Executive Director

The prospects for determining the investment needed in our highway transportation system in the post-Major Moves era took a positive turn during the current Indiana state legislative session with a proposal authored by Representative Ed Soliday (R-Valparaiso). HB 1371 creates a Joint Study Committee on Transportation Infrastructure Assessment and Solutions that will focus on highways, rural roads, air and rail needs of the state. Rep. Soliday has indicated a timeline for the Committee's work which includes hearings in the summer of 2011 to collect data on what projects are needed, and then hearings in the summer of 2012 to discuss how to fund those needs. His goal is to have a comprehensive proposal to share with the legislature in the 2013 session. Rep. Soliday said that he hopes the Committee hearings will produce a thorough analysis of statewide transportation needs and creative thought on funding options. He recognizes the importance of the entire transportation system to Indiana's economy and thinks it can be improved upon for the benefit of the state. HB 1371 passed both the House and Senate and has been signed into law by Governor Daniels. BIC will continue to work closely with Representative Soliday as this Committee is formed and begins meeting later this year.

Meanwhile, SB 473, authored by Senator Tom Wyss (R-Ft. Wayne), would simplify Indiana's ability to enter into public-private partnerships for highway projects. The bill passed the Senate but has stalled in the House due to the five week walkout by House Democrats. Representative Ed Soliday did hold an informational hearing last week on SB 473, where almost all of the testimony given was in support of the measure. Since the Democrats returned to work earlier this week, the House of Representatives has been focused on House bills needing action by a March 31 deadline. Presumably they will consider Senate bills beginning next week.

On the federal front, Indiana was the location of a House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee listening session in mid-February conducted by Chairman John Mica (R-Florida). At the invitation of Indiana Congressman Larry Bucshon (R-8th), Build Indiana Council and several members participated in a panel discussion moderated by Chairman Mica. Keith Lochmueller of Bernardin, Lochmueller & Associates, Inc., Jeff Mulzer of Mulzer Crushed Stone, Inc. and J. H. Rudolph & Co., Inc., and Ted Lucas of Milestone Contractors, L.P. (*all pictured on right*), all participated on the panel along with INDOT Commissioner Mike Cline and Deputy Commissioner Sam Sarvis, Indianapolis Mayor Greg Ballard, Voices for I-69 Executive Director Steve Schaefer and Celadon Trucking CEO Steve Russell. Additional participants included Indiana Congressmen Todd Rokita and Mike Pence as well as Pennsylvania Congressman Bill Shuster. Overall it was a unique opportunity for our industry to have a robust conversation about highway funding issues with the Committee Chairman and members of the Indiana delegation.



Meanwhile, regarding reauthorization of the federal highway bill, Chairman Mica indicates that the new bill will be revenue constrained. The Highway Trust Fund can currently support about \$35 billion per year over six years (\$210B). This would be a 17 percent decline in highway funding. On the other hand, President Obama has proposed a \$551 billion program (\$336 B for highways and \$110 B for transit) with no specific recommendation on how to raise the additional revenue. Senate Environment and Public Works Chair Barbara Boxer (D-California) indicates her committee will have a bill moving by May, but no details have been released on that Committee's proposal.

## USGS RELEASES AGGREGATES PRODUCTION FOR 2010

A preliminary report from the U.S. Geological Survey reported that an estimated 1,170 million metric tons of crushed stone were sold or used in 2010, compared to the same number in 2009.

The estimated output of construction sand and gravel produced in 2010 was 814 million metric tons, a modest decrease of 3 percent from 2009.

Total production for crushed stone, sand and gravel for 2010 was 1.984 billion metric tons compared to 2.0 billion metric tons in 2009, a 1 percent decrease.

## 97th Annual Purdue Road School — March 8-10, 2011

At the Annual Purdue Road School this year, **Andy Gauck of Harrison Sand & Gravel** made a presentation in the Pavement Preservation: Build a Better Chip Seal section. Andy presented information to attendees on the various testing needed to make an evaluation of what they should buy and or is needed for a good chip and seal road. He discussed INDOT tests and gradations and how they might be useful in this selection of aggregates for roadways. Andy also discussed the new CS 16 (Chip Seal) gradation that INDOT desires for their roads.

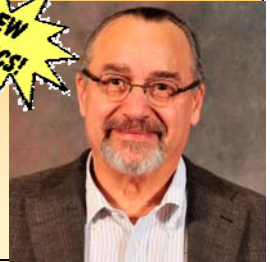
